CRICKET

A resounding victory by all four XI's over Southgate County ended a season in which the school recorded the following total results:

Played 42; Won 16; Lost 11; Drew 15.

The 1st XI, after losing their first two matches, remained unbeaten for the rest of the season. Highest scorer was Strong with 122 runs at an average of 15.25, to his credit. His nearest rival was Don with 70 runs. The most successful bowlers were Fincham (21 wkts., avge. 9.7), Lee (18 wkts. avge. 9.4.) Shanks (34 wkts. avge. 4.6).

The 2nd XI had an unbeaten season under numerous captains. Robinson topped the bowling with 17 wkts. and Smith the batting with 96 runs.

The Southgate, Wood Green and Potters Bar Schools Country competition for Intermediates was entered for the first time. Minchenden were placed third out of nine schools entering, Robinson finishing in 5th place.

At the Middlesex Grammar Schools competition at Parliament Hill a weakened team finished 22nd in a field of 25 schools, Chopping (60th) being our first man home.

In the local Grammar Schools meeting at Broomfield Park there was a marked improvement in our performance. Fruin was 1st in the junior high jump. In the intermediate competition the school finished second to Trinity. Robinson, Kingston, Johnson and Lamb all gaining second places in the respective events. In the Senior events Withers was 1st in the 220 yards with a new record time, while the relay team of Mason, Withers, Dunwoody and Don were also 1st. Gibbs was 2nd in the High Jump and Don 2nd in the 100 yards.

In the County Finals at Chiswick, Withers was placed 2nd in the 220 yards final. The prime achievement was that of the Senior relay team who won the county championship and received county plaques in recognition of their efforts.
